

Dr. Charles Rupprecht is the director of the Rabies Program at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and also serves as an adjunct professor in the Population Biology, Ecology, & Evolution Training Program at Emory University. In his work at the CDC, Dr. Rupprecht is chief of the OIE Reference Laboratory for Rabies and director of the World Health Organization Collaborating Center for Rabies Reference and Research. Dr. Rupprecht has been recognized by the National Institutes of Health and World Health Organization for his research on rabies control and has held positions on a number of advisory committees, including his service as Expert Technical Advisor on Rabies for the World Health Organization since 1990. Dr. Rupprecht earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Ecology from Rutgers College, a Master of Science degree in Zoology from the University of Wisconsin, a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the University of Pennsylvania, and a doctoral degree in Biological Sciences from the University of Wisconsin.
